Filippa Bergin is Head of Strategy, Impact & Growth at Global Child Forum, a non-profit foundation established by the Swedish King Carl XVI Gustaf and Queen Silvia in 2009. The organisation is dedicated to influencing global business actors and the financial sector to improve their impact on children and children's rights. Global Child Forum, and its partner Boston Consulting Group, also produce the world's largest benchmark on business and children's rights.

Filippa is a sustainability leader with over 25 years of experience of driving societal impact. Upon joining Global Child Forum as Head of Research and Development in January 2020, she has been tasked with increasing the organisation's impact on multinational companies, developing products and services to support child-inclusive governance, and enhancing the reach and impact of the foundation's annual benchmark, State of Children's Rights and Business (which serves 2,000 global multinationals in the 'SDG2000' company group). Filippa has also been instrumental in developing and providing ESG data to asset managers, while ensuring their support of child-inclusive investing. Filippa is now head of strategy, impact and growth.

As a spokesperson for Global Child Forum, Filippa focuses on raising awareness about social impact in business and investments, with a particular emphasis on children. She also addresses the EU legislative landscape on sustainability and its impact on children.

Additionally, as an independent Sustainability Adviser and founder of Invest in Change, Filippa advises companies such as Atlas Copco, Swedbank, and ICA Banken on sustainable business practices. Prior to that, she served in the UN, WHO, and Amnesty Business Group.

Filippa holds several board and honorary positions contributing with results focused on impact; she is a board member of the Swedish Authority on Development Cooperation (Sida), Ports of Stockholm AB, and the Media Council (Medieombudsmannen) in Sweden. She has also been part of the board of SOS Children's Villages Sweden, the London-based International Institute of Environment and Development (iied) and the stakeholder council of the Global Reporting Initiative (GRI).

Filippa holds a Master of Law (LLM) from Uppsala University and has studied at the Johns Hopkins University, Paul H Nitze School of Advanced International Studies.

She lives in central Stockholm and has 2 children.
